Introduction

Ukrainian Woman is an international project supporting Ukrainian women artists and cultural professionals through collaboration, co-creation, and increased visibility across Europe.

The project aims to foster international partnerships, develop new cultural projects, and strengthen the presence of Ukrainian voices in the European cultural landscape.

This guide is designed to support participating teams in creating their new cultural projects, which will later be shared through the framework of the U-Woman project.

The document provides a structured roadmap for cultural cooperation on the platform, project development, ensuring alignment with the initiative's goals and expected EU quality standards.

Tools for cooperation and co-creation

Any registered artist and organisation has several ways to cooperate with project teams and other artists directly on the CCC platform, including:

establishing contact with other community members by sending contact requests	using specific search criteria consistently available across the platform (country of residence, name, art category)	gradually discovering collaboration opportunities through platform tools	joining projects marked as "Ongoing"
exchanging personal messages	inviting community members to join active projects	using the internal project team chat	initiating a new project

Project Eligibility Conditions

Partnership

The project must be implemented by at least two participants (individuals and/or legal entities) who work together to achieve the defined goals. International partnership is considered an additional advantage.

Registration on the Cultural Cooperation Community platform

All project participants must be registered on the [Cultural Cooperation Community platform](https://uw-community.com/) and have active profiles.

Professional experience

Participants must demonstrate relevant professional experience in the cultural and creative sectors.

- ◆ a short Curriculum Vitae (CV)
- ◆ or/and a brief portfolio presenting previously implemented cultural projects and activities.

Geographical eligibility

Project team members must be citizens or residents of the forty-one countries participating in the [Creative Europe Programme](#).

Participants from the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom, China, South Korea, Brazil, Argentina, Australia, and New Zealand are also eligible, as well as organisations registered in these countries.

However, priority will be given to participants, partnerships, and projects involving representatives from countries participating in the Creative Europe Programme, in line with the objectives of strengthening European cultural cooperation and transnational collaboration within the European cultural space.

Sector relevance and project structure:

Projects in the cultural and creative sectors must meet all of the following requirements:

- ◆ have clearly defined overall objectives;
- ◆ include well-described expected outcomes, both qualitative and, where possible, quantitative;
- ◆ include a list and description of tasks (activities) to be carried out within the project.
- ◆ demonstrate relevance to the mission of the Ukrainian Woman project, including themes of Ukrainian cultural representation, women's participation in the cultural sector, or international cultural collaboration
